Weekly Experiences

In Gants Hill children have been making cookies. Cooking activities are a great resource that staff can utilise to help children develop in a variety of areas of learning. Through the process of cooking, children are able to develop skills such as, turn taking, counting, fine motor skills, speaking, listening and attention, just to name a few.

Ingredients

Makes: 35

- 225g butter, softened
- 110g caster sugar
- 275g plain flour

Method

Prep:15mins

Cook:10min

Preheat oven to 180 C / Gas 4.

Cream the butter in a large bowl or in a food mixer until soft. Add the sugar and beat until the mixture is light and fluffy.

Sift in the flour and bring the mixture together to form a dough.

Using your hands,roll the dough into walnut-size balls and place them slightly apart on a baking tray. Flatten them slightly and bake in the oven for 13-15 minutes or until they are a light golden brown and slightly firm on top.

Carefully transfer the cookies to a wire rack to cool.

The children in Rainbowfish room, South Woodford have been making their own post boxes using containers and tubes. The children used bottle tops to post through the slots, which had been cut by practitioners. The children spent a long period of time at this activity and used their fine motor skills to ensure they could

fit the bottle tops into the slots. These activities are also great for the development of hand-eye coordination.

Cooking with children is fun and it teaches them mathematics, science, and pre-reading skills, plus it gives them fine motor and sensory stimulation. Cooking <u>healthy</u> <u>foods</u> with children helps them to become familiar with the foods and gives them more interest in <u>trying</u> something they haven't tried or liked before.

The children in Stingrays room South Woodford have been engaging in water play in the garden. They have made the most of the warmer weather and got themselves a little wet in the process! The children used their senses to explore the water, they also had resources in the water which enhanced this play opportunity. They were listening to the sounds the water makes when splashing, which is a listening skill that can assist with their reading in the future, such as being able to segment and blend phonics.

It helps the body and the mind work together. Exposing children to music during early development helps them learn the sounds and meanings of words.
